English I supply list

- A two-three-inch, three-ring binder (any color).
- A composition book or notebook for journals.
  - Pencils. Please try to avoid using pens for assignments. When using pens, use black or blue ink.
  - A pack of red-ink pens and a pack of blue-ink pens. These will be used for editing (not for writing assignments).
  - A pack of college-ruled notebook paper. A ream of copy paper, paper plates
  - Please purchase the novels *To Kill A Mockingbird* by Harper Lee, *Fahrenheit 451* by Ray Bradbury, and *Last Book in the Universe* by Rodman Philbrick at a bookstore such as Barnes and Noble, Books-A-Million, etc.

AP English III supply list

- A two-three-inch, three-ring binder (any color).
- Two composition book or notebook for journals.
- Pencils. Please try to avoid pens for written assignments. When using pens, use black or blue ink.
- A pack of blue pens and a pack of red pens. Or a pack of multi-color pens. These will be used to edit. These should not be used for assignments.
- A ream of paper, paper plates, plastic eating utensils

**Novels:** We will be reading from a wide variety of sources, including essays, editorials, speeches, letters, etc. Of course, we will also be reading novels. To start off the year, please purchase the novels *The Scarlet Letter* by Nathaniel Hawthorne, *The Great Gatsby* by F. Scott Fitzgerald, *Their Eyes were Watching God* by Zora Neale Hurston, *March* by Geraldine Brooks, and *The Things They Carried* by Tim O'Brien at a bookstore such as Barnes and Noble, Books-A-Million, etc. They are usually around \$7-\$9. Please let me know if you are not financially able to purchase this and I will attempt to locate a copy.

\* Also, students will be taking the AP test at the end of the year. To help prepare, please purchase the Barron's AP English Language and Composition workbook. This can also be found at Barnes and Noble. Please make sure it is "language" and composition and not "literature"
